



Crossing U.S. Border From Canada

When crossing the US Border from Canada you must check in with US Customs and Border Protection after your trip, you will be asked for the document given to you at the Canadian Ranger Station where you entered for your Quetico Canoe Trip. The local office is located in the new US Forest Service Building at 1369 E Hwy 169, just across from the International Wolf Center.

Returning to US by Air

All U.S. citizens including children must present a passport or secure travel document when entering the United States by air.

Returning to US by Land/Sea

Starting June 1, 2009 all U.S. and Canadian Citizens who are 16 and older traveling between the U.S. and Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, and Bermuda by land or sea (including ferries), will be required to present a valid passport or other alternative documents as determined by the Department of Homeland Security. U.S. and Canadian citizens who are 15 years old or younger will still be allowed to travel with just a copy of their birth certificate, as will teens between the age of 16-18 if they are part of an Adult supervised school, religious, cultural or athletic group.
